Claim 1 fails to distinguish structurally and patentably from Overbeke particularly Figures 5 and 6 thereof, therefore the claim is rejected on this patent.

Claim 2 is rejected on Dahl in view of Bach since to extend bridle lines to the ends of 1 of Dahl would not require invention in view of 8 of Bach.

Claims 7 and 10 are rejected on Dahl in view of Astle. The use on the Dahl kite of bridles according to the teaching of Astle would not produce any new or unexpected result so far as can be seen.

Claim 8 is rejected on Guillo in view of Astle. The addition of other bridles to what is shown in Guillo would not produce any new and inventive result after the disclosure of Astle.

Claim 9 is rejected on the same references and grounds as claim 7 from which it depends. The use of the swivel joint is so common and well known that no invention lies in using it wherever desired.

Claims 3 to 6 are allowed.
