



FOUR RECEIVE SERVICE PINS

In informal ceremonies held last week, Dr. H. J. E. Reid, Director, presented meritorious service emblems to four staff members.

Receiving the ruby-studded 20-year pin were Francis M. Rogallo, Head of the 7 by 10-foot Tunnels Branch, and Silas Carney, Structural Steel Section.

The emerald-studded 25-year pins were presented to Paul Kuhn, Assistant Chief of the Structures Research Division, and Herbert C. Roehm, Assistant Superintendent of Machine Shop.

Rogallo was born in Sanger, California. He received his B.S. degree in Mechanical Engineering in 1933 and his M.S. degree in 1935 from Stanford University. He joined the Laboratory staff on July 13, 1936 as a junior aeronautical engineer at the Atmospheric Wind Tunnel. He was appointed assistant head of AWT in 1939 and was assigned to his present position in 1944.

Carney is a native Hamptonian.

He attended high school in Hampton and worked as a machinist's helper at the Newport News Shipbuilding and Dry Dock Company before joining the Langley staff on May 11, 1936. He had several breaks in service and reached the 20-year mark on July 18, 1936. On October 23, 1955 he transferred to the Structural Steel Section.

Kuhn was born in Berlin, Germany. He graduated from high school in Berlin and received his B.S. degree in Aeronautical Engineering from the University of Michigan. He entered on duty at the Laboratory on June 29, 1931 as a junior aeronautical engineer. He was appointed to his present position in 1952.

Roehm is a native of Baltimore, Maryland. He graduated from Maury High School in Norfolk and entered on duty at the Laboratory as an apprentice on July 9, 1931. He transferred from the Machine Shop to Instrument Service on May 27, 1940. He was assigned to West Machine Shop in 1943 and was appointed to his present position in 1947.
