PRELIMINARY STATEMENT FOR ALLISON

William M. Allison, of Dayton, County of Montgomery, and State of Ohio, being duly sworn, deposes and says that he is a party to Interference No. 87,047, declared by the Commissioner of Patents on June 14, 1954, between an application for Letters Patent filed by Gertrude S. Rogallo et al and the application of William M. Allison, Serial No. 183,870, filed September 8, 1950, for Kite:

That the invention set forth in the count of interference was made in the United States of America;

That other than layout drawings from which actual test models were cut, the first drawing of the invention was made approximately during the month of July, 1948;

That the subject matter of the count of the interference was first conceived during the month of March, 1947, and was first disclosed to others in the late spring of 1947;

✓ That the first written description of the invention was made on or about January 7, 1950;

✓ That on or about the seventeenth day of September, 1947, the first experimental model embodying the subject matter of the count of the interference was completed and successfully tested;

✓ That the dates of acts susceptible of proof, other than those above specified, which, if proven, would establish conception, due diligence and actual reduction to practice, range from the seventeenth day of September, 1947, and comprise the construction and testing of kites of various shapes and sizes all embodying the subject matter of the count of the interference;

✓ That active exercise of reasonable diligence toward reducing the invention to practice began during the month of March, 1947;

That there are no prior applications of the United States or countries foreign thereto disclosing the invention set forth in the count of the interference, the filing date of which may be claimed herein; and

That the invention has never been abandoned.
